Nordic Life Science co-operation for stronger competitiveness

With the aim of a strong and competitive Life Science sector, what do we need in the form of strategies, initiatives and future collaborations?

The national associations of the pharmaceutical industry in the Nordic countries invite interested parties to a digital seminar on 18 March to discuss how national Life Science strategies and increased cooperation can lead to a more competitive Nordic region.

Together the Nordic countries can offer world-class research and research infrastructure, a health care system of a high international standard, competitive industry and world-leading innovation. To handle the increasing competition in the Life Science sector, several national strategies to improve conditions for the Life Science industry and increase its competitiveness have been developed in the Nordic countries. But more and more countries are investing in the field of Life Science, both inside and outside Europe. So, what is required to make the Nordic region a leading Life Science region globally? The programme for the seminar includes sessions with the heads of the Danish and Swedish Life Science offices, Carsten Kjær Joensen and Jenni Nordborg, as well as equivalent representatives from Norway and Finland; sessions on clinical research and health data; and finally a Nordic panel will discuss how to take the next step in meeting high expectations when it comes to establishing the Nordic region as a globally leading life science region.
